Location Details:

- **Primary Address:** 101–103 Gore Street, Cambridge, MA.
- **Historical Site:** The business operated here from approximately 1861 until the early 1890s.
- **Later Expansion:** In 1892, Hamill moved the factory to a larger building on the corner of **Bent and Sixth Streets** in East Cambridge.
